Early decisions vital with the legal aspects of relationships

The welfare of any children involved should be the first consideration with any decision making. Taking early legal advice can address fears and help with the planning of important future arrangements.

A solicitor can help identify where you may need to take the advice of other qualified persons, for example in relation to financial matters, such as pensions, investments, tax or mortgages.

Speaking with a solicitor does not mean that a partner, or indeed any other person, will know. Solicitors have a duty of confidentiality towards their clients. Taking early, confidential advice could help to eliminate uncertainties or worries, and help you to focus on your priorities and what you want to achieve for you and your family.
